Scott Jewers:

The Civilian Review and Complaints Commission for the Royal Canadian Mounted Police ("the Commission") has received your complaint dated March 27, 2023.

A copy of the complaint form containing the details you provided is attached.

The Public Complaint Process

As specified in the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act*, a copy of your complaint has been sent to the RCMP. An investigator will be assigned to your complaint and you may be asked to provide additional information and/or a statement to assist with the investigation.

The RCMP is required to notify you of the status of its investigation within 45 days of receiving your complaint from the Commission and must continue to send you monthly updates until its investigation has been completed.

Informal Resolution

The RCMP may ask you to consider an informal resolution of your complaint. Any attempt to informally resolve your complaint requires your consent AND the consent of each RCMP member whose conduct is the subject of the complaint.

Additionally, the specific terms of the resolution (what both parties have

agreed to) as well as the agreement of all parties (you, the members involved) to those terms must be signified in writing.

If you have any questions about the informal resolution process, do not hesitate to contact the Commission prior to providing your consent to an informal resolution.

Informally resolving your complaint means that you have reached an agreement with the RCMP on the action(s) it will undertake to address your concerns.

If you agree to the terms of an informal resolution with the RCMP, there will be no further investigation of your complaint and the matter will be considered resolved.

Notification from the RCMP Concerning the Outcome of Your Complaint

If your complaint is not informally resolved, the RCMP will conduct an investigation. As previously noted, you may be asked to provide additional information and/or a statement to assist with the investigation.

At the conclusion of the investigation, the RCMP will provide you with a report (typically a letter), which will include:

- a summary of your complaint;
- the findings of the RCMP's investigation;
- an explanation of any action that the RCMP has taken or will be taking; and
- information about your right to refer your complaint to the Commission for review, should you not be satisfied with the report.

Please note that the RCMP may, in some cases, refuse to investigate or continue an investigation into a complaint. If your complaint is refused or terminated, the RCMP must inform you of its decision and the reasons for it. If you disagree with the RCMP's decision, you may refer your complaint to the Commission for an independent review.

Referral of Your Complaint to the Commission for Review

Please note that you must wait for the RCMP to provide you, in writing, a report outlining how it has addressed your complaint **before** you can refer your complaint to the Commission for review.

Your request to have your complaint reviewed by the Commission must be made *in writing AND within 60 calendar days* from the date you receive the RCMP's report.

DETAILS OF COMPLAINT / DÉTAILS DE LA PLAINTE

THE FOLLOWING WAS RECEIVED BY THE COMMISSION VIA ONLINE COMPLAINT FORM:

WITNESS: Evidence has been submitted., Neither RCMP, HRP or CSIS is contesting.

DETAILS:

HRP lied and had me falsely arrested because they knew their Chief was implicated. NSHA knew they screwed up big time and tried to cover it all up - the recordings and facts are CHILLING. NSHA had serious quantified complaints put in against them, direct and non contestable evidence that HRP lied. Meaning NSHA knew they had to file complaint against HRP, and so JDIrving.

And since RCMP knows I'm right, they keep claiming that because NSHA claims I'm retarded, I don't get rights. When I'm reporting serious and quantified federal Crimes.

The evidence is compelling. The technical documents and proof is non contestable.

Yes, the Officers should have done their Jobs properly. However clearly, their leadership lied to them about this and didn't tell them anything about what really happened. They sent those Officers here hoping they would act on their prejudice and bias. Basically they set the Officers up to fail, so those Officers could then be extorted. It doesn't excuse the negligence of those Officers, but shows Leadership would literally frame their Officers. And as those Officers... you must know what your superiors are doing... So they know their Bosses are trying to ruin their lives, while there is a clear well recorded history of that Behavior by RCMP. Those Officers are scared... And leadership are exploiting it, hoping they will act with Prejudice and Bias.

RCMP stalking on multiple occasions because i'm gay, and because i protested Racism and then because "the right kind of white" was being questioned. And then when presented with incredible evidence, RCMP basically stated because they think i have a mental illness I don't get rights... I'm not allowed to open a Case. Because this implicates multiple RCMP Officers... I do not have a mental illness, and even if I did... this is a Hate Crime and absolutely discrimination and a violation of my Chartered rights. Ongoing for over 4 years.

Dozens of requests, some written, others verbal were made to RCMP... instead of allowing me to, they kept showing up here telling me they were looking for reason to charge me... Phishing as I caught them looking around my property and into my vehicles... As i pleaded and begged them to be reasonable. As I reported and provided direct and compelling evidence of serious Federal Crimes.

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THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION WAS RECEIVED VIA TELEPHONE ON MARCH 27, 2023:

During a follow-up telephone conversation with Scott JEWERS on March 27, 2023, he explained that many RCMP members have attended his home at the request of the Nova Scotia Health Authority and/or as a result of his email communications to a wide distribution list of officials, including the NSHA, the RCMP, the Halifax Regional Police, members of Parliament, news media outlets, etc. He states that his emails contain no threat and are simply updates to his attempts to provide evidence against a former employer and other people whom he believe have made him a target of harassment and other crimes.

S. JEWERS alleges neglect of duty on the part of the RCMP for responding to the Nova Scotia Health Authority (NSHA) requests for wellness checks and for not accepting or reading the evidence he wishes to provide the police. He mentioned that members from both the Sheet Harbor and Sherbrooke detachments attended his residence. He suspects that their decision to show up at his place was ordered by superior ranking officers and felt that the members may be not be held responsible. However, for the purpose of the complaint process, Unknown NS members have been included to represent the members who attended or made the decision to do so.

S. JEWERS also noted that he has also been involved with the Halifax Regional Police (HRP) who apprehended him under the Involuntary Psychiatric Treatment Act (IPTA) on or about August 16, 2022 and transported him to the hospital where he remained for 10 days. However, this complaint is meant to address the allegations of misconduct by RCMP members. He noted that, approximately one week after his interaction with the HRP, he received the visit of 2 RCMP members (1 male and 1 female) from the Sheet Harbor detachment, at the request of NSHA. According to S. JEWERS, he tried to explain a portion of the evidence that he had after which the female stepped back and said something along the line of 'don't you think it's something you're not supposed to know' and the male officer told him 'it's above our pay grade'. S. JEWERS indicated that the members left and no further action was taken by the police to review his evidence or open a file.

S. JEWERS indicated that in December 2022, two (2) other RCMP members (males of the Sherbrooke detachment) showed up at his place and appeared to search the grounds, peeping into his 2 vehicles' windows and almost entering his house after he had left the door slightly ajar to let his dog out, as he noticed the officers about to peep or get into the home as a result of the crack in the doorway. He noted that the members informed him that they had been asked to attend as result of the complainant's email communications (which he had sent to a number of entities). S. JEWERS noted that he asked if he could talk to a lawyer and enquired where he could make a police report about the crimes against him by a number of parties but the members did not have answers for him. He noted that there was another instance in December 2022, during which a female officer and a male officer (from Sheet Harbor) attended his home. Similarly to the other attendances, the members felt that they could not help him with his report of crime and the male member told him that the police were not reading his email communications.

The complainant indicated that on March 13, 2023, he opted to go to the HRP office to file a police report and to the CSIS office in Halifax to drop off his evidence. He noted that after he left, he received a call from female officer Jessica of the Sheet Harbor detachment asking him where he was. He noted that shortly after, he was pulled over in Dartmouth by a male officer who apprehended him following a report by NSHA.

From the Commission's understanding, according to S. JEWERS, he's made many attempts since September 2021 to provide the police evidence that he has been a target of harassment and criminal wrongdoings which coincide with outside events involving political and media entities. He feels that the police have no reason to respond to NSHA's requests and that the RCMP fail to take his evidence, open a file or provide him guidance on where to direct his concerns.
